Student Programs and Services

The Office of Undergraduate Admissions hosts many programs for incoming students and parents throughout the year. Below are the programs and a brief description of each.

Open House

Undergraduate Admissions hosts Open House programs during both the fall and spring. The program is designed for students who are considering applying to WSU, those who have already applied and their friends and families. At the programs, students can speak with representatives from schools and colleges, athletics, housing, financial aid and many more! There are presentations for students and parents on admissions, financial aid and public safety as well. Area Information Sessions

These sessions are held in various cities throughout the tri-county area. The sessions are held in the evenings and are designed to answer questions about applying to WSU, housing options, financial aid and more. Admissions Presentation and Campus Tour

We provide admissions presentations with a campus tour Mondays through Fridays at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., and campus tours on Saturdays at 2 p.m. Students and their friends and families can come down to campus and take a walking tour of the area, classrooms and our residence halls. Students who are invited to Scholars Day are notified between December and February.
